

Again, this year we included in the program our annual President's Award. This is presented to an Irish Catholic individual who has made outstanding contributions to the Irish community. Nominations are accepted from Hibernian members and AOH President Branson makes the selection. This year's winner is long-time supporter and member of AOH, Joe McGinley.



Since we did not have our usual Celebration. we didn't have a printed program to display our Map of Ireland page. So, in partnership with Beltrame Leffler Advertising, we designed an 18" x 24" print piece. Indiana Families of Ireland, that showcased our local

Irish community and commemorated our deceased family members. The money raised will be used for two purposes. The first \$3,000 will support St. Meinrad's and funds in excess will help fund donations to local charities throughout the year.
