The Library of Trinity College (below) contains around 7 million printed volumes and significant quantities of manuscripts, including the Book of Kells, which arrived at the college in 1661 for safekeeping after the Cromwellian raids on religious institutions. The collection housed in the Long Room includes a rare copy of the 1916 Proclamation of the Irish Republic and a 15th-century wooden harp, which is the model for the current emblem of Ireland. The library receives more than 500,000 visitors per year, making it the most important in Ireland.

The university has educated many of Ireland's poets, playwrights and authors, including Oscar Wilde, Jonathan Swift, Bram Stoker, William Trevor, Oliver Goldsmith and William Congreve, Nobel Laureates Samuel Beckett, Ernest Walton, Mairead ments. The book is an illuminated manuscript of the four gospels—probably the most lavish and accomplished illuminated manuscript in the world. The exhibit also has illustrated panels that describe all the elements that went into medieval bookmaking, the making of ink, the making of vellum, elaborate symbols used, the monastic life, etc.
