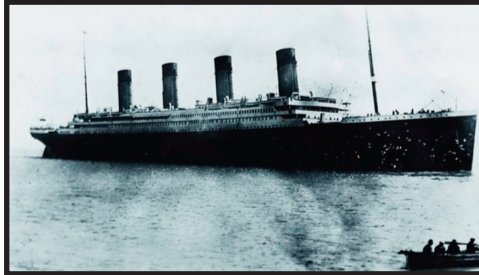

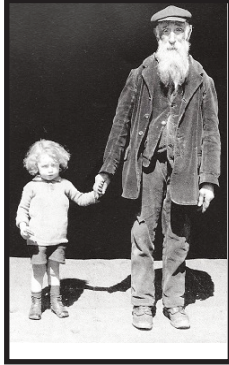

## Fr. Frank Browne

One of the greatest and most productive twentieth century amateur Irish photographers was a Jesuit priest named Francis (Frank) Mary Hegarty Browne. When he passed away at age 80 in 1960, he had produced over 42,000 negatives.

Frank Browne was born in 1880 in Cork, Ireland the youngest of the eight children. He was raised and supported by his uncle, Robert Browne, Bishop of Cloyne, who bought him his first camera shortly before the younger man embarked on a tour of Europe at age 17.

Upon his return to Ireland in 1897, he joined the Jesuits and was ordained a priest in 1912 by his uncle, Bishop Cloyne. As an ordination gift the Bishop gave Frank a ticket for the maiden voyage of RMS Titanic from Southampton, England, to Queenstown (Cobh), Ireland. Browne took dozens of photographs of life aboard Titanic on that day and the next morning. He didn't continue on the trip to New York. When the news of the ship's sinking reached him, he realized that his photos would be of great interest, and he negotiated their sale to various newspapers and news cartels. They appeared in publications around the world. Browne retained the negatives. The Eastman Kodak company subsequently gave him free film for life.

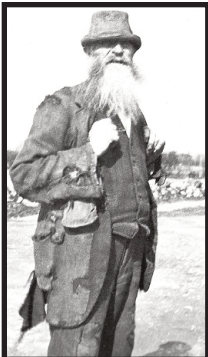
AOH is seeking the gaming license to conduct this raffle.

## Father Glenn O'Connor

In 1999, when he was pastor of St. Joseph Catholic Church on the city's southwest side, Father Glenn O'Connor co-founded Seeds of Hope halfway house for women which he then located in the parish convent. The home serves as a refuge for women who suffer from alcohol and substance abuse.

The grand opening of a new, second Father Glenn O'Connor Home, took place on July 14th, 2021. Located at 1425 Mickley Ave., Indianapolis, it is located next to the original, still operating Seeds of Hope building.

Fr. Glenn passed away in March of 2019. During his days at St. Joe's and until his passing, Fr. Glenn also served as chaplain of AOH.

A room in the new home has been dedicated to deceased, three time Past-President of AOH, Jim McCaughna. The room was sponsored by the McCaughna family.
