"**The Banshees of Inisherin**" 9 nominations: **Best Picture**, **Lead Actor** (Colin Farrell), **Supporting Actor** (Brendan Gleeson, Barry Keoghan), **Supporting Actress** (Kerry Condon), **Director** (Martin McDonagh), **Film Editing** (Mikkel E.G. Nielsen), **Original Score** (Carter Burwell), and **Writing - Original Screenplay** (Martin McDonagh).

"**The Quiet Girl**" ("An Cailín Ciúin") first-ever Irish language film to receive a nomination in the **International Feature Film** category.

Paul Mescal was a first-time nominee in the **Lead Actor** category for his role in "**Aftersun**." He joined Colin Farrell in that category.

Richard Baneham won in **Visual Effects** for "**Avatar: The Way of Water**."

Three hundred women participated in Ireland's 1916 Easter Rising.
